1T4 is a new residential event for 11 to 14 year olds offered by URC Youth and the URC Children's and Youth Work team.






Three young people from West Midlands Synod were baptised at Dursley Tabernacle last month. You can watch the service on https://youtu.be/JziBxivloE0?

THE CLUBHOUSE HOLIDAY CLUB 2025

SCHOOLS VISITS RESOURCE How can your church build relationship with local schools through hospitality?

This new, free resource has been compiled by the Children's Ministry Network and ROOTS for Churches, with input from the URC Children's and Youth Work team. It looks at reasons for hosting a school visit, how to host them well, how to build further relations with the school and with children and families, and has suggestions for other activities and themed visits that your church might offer your local schools.

For the 11–17-year-olds in your church or outreach orbit, poet and author Dai Woolridge has created the *Six Beats One Story* youth resource.

Over eight sessions, young people are encouraged to get creative as they read the Bible, engage with God's word, respond through written word, performance or conversation, and share their discoveries with others.

In 2022, Dai Woolridge wrote a book called *Six Beats, One Story*. This book splits the big story of the Bible into six digestible chunks: Origins, Exodus, Exile, Messiah, Spirit and Home. It takes the reader on a journey through the themes, characters and stories in each chunk, and links everything to the big, overarching story of the Bible. All this in prose and rhyme. This beautifully unique

way of traversing the Bible has now been adapted into a free, online youth resource.
