

You will also see in the mailing our new leaflet giving ideas for creating a <u>"welcome bag"</u> for children and others visiting your church.






The next Holiday Club from the URC Children's and Youth Work team is now online on bit.ly/URC-holidayclub

Copyright is complicated! The URC Communications Team has update its booklet, which, whilst not claiming to be a definitive guide, will help you navigate your way through the potential minefield of copyright law and how it affects churches.

This booklet sets out to do two things: to take you through some of these licences and agencies, explaining how and when each should be used; and to look at a variety of common copyright scenarios that churches may find themselves in – such as using sheet music, showing TV programmes or photocopying from magazines.
